



FMS Partners will provide you access to all services through a variety of methods including a referral system that includes:

- A “warm handoff” for you with a personal introduction by a staff member when two partners are in the same center.
- An immediate phone call while you are still at the staff person’s desk to set up an appointment with another partner organization that is not located in the Center.
- Access to a private location for you to talk to another partner organization not located in the Center.
- A referral sheet indicating which agency you are being referred to, accompanied by a brochure that explains the services the agency will be providing to the customer.
