

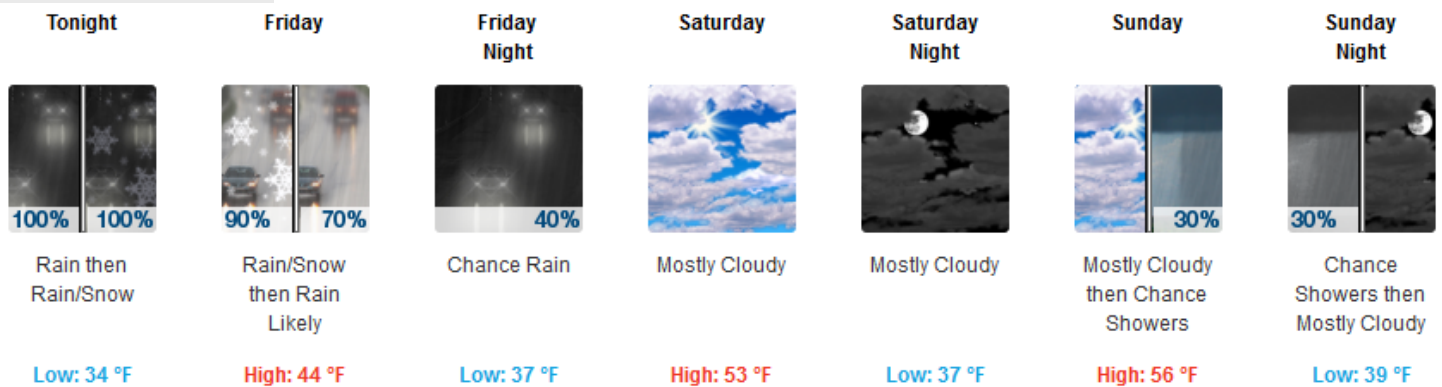

OES DAILY SITUATION REPORT – for April 16, 2021
 Current Activation Status: Level 3 – Monitoring

Current Incidents:

- 04/15/21 (5:11 am): NWS has issued a Hazardous Weather Outlook for our area. A dynamic storm system is expected to bring light to moderate wet snow to the higher terrain and a rain/snow mix to the valleys Thursday night into Friday.
- NYS DEC Burn Ban IN EFFECT March 16th to May 14th.
- April 2021 – NYS DOT has informed us that construction at the I-88 Exit 20 (Richmondville) Westbound on-ramp and off-ramps will continue through 2021 as follows:
 - I-88 WB off-ramp at Exit 20 will be closed, and WB traffic will be directed to use Exit 21 (Warnerville).
 - I-88 WB on-ramp at Exit 20 will be closed, and WB traffic will be detoured to Exit 19 (Worcester).
- Schoharie County State of Emergency (March 16, 2020) is still in effect due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- Schoharie County Buildings are open to the public by **Appointment Only**. (06/15/2020).

Public Signup for COVID Vaccination Clinic Notification: Schoharie County has developed a website for people to sign up to receive notification when vaccination clinics are scheduled. Include as much information as possible (home phone, cell phone, email) and click on one of the eligibility groups in the listing for “reason for wanting vaccine”. We also recommend that you assist your elderly or computer illiterate friends and family by signing them up with their information or yours.

PLEASE NOTE THIS DOES NOT SIGN YOU UP FOR AN ACTUAL VACCINE – RATHER NOTIFICATION OF UPCOMING CLINICS.

You will receive notification when DOH’s weekly POD is scheduled (via phone, text and/or email) with instructions for locating the link to register for an appointment. It is the only way to distribute **extremely limited** vaccine to those eligible individuals in a fair and impartial manner.

Persons Tested Positive by County



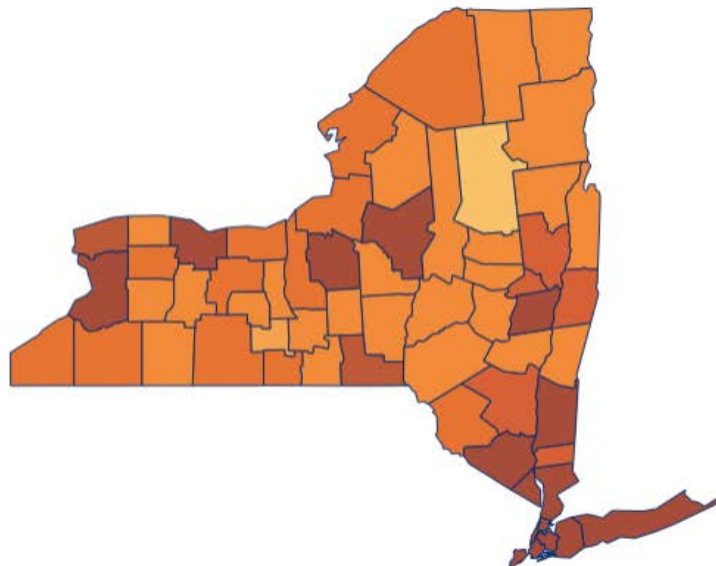

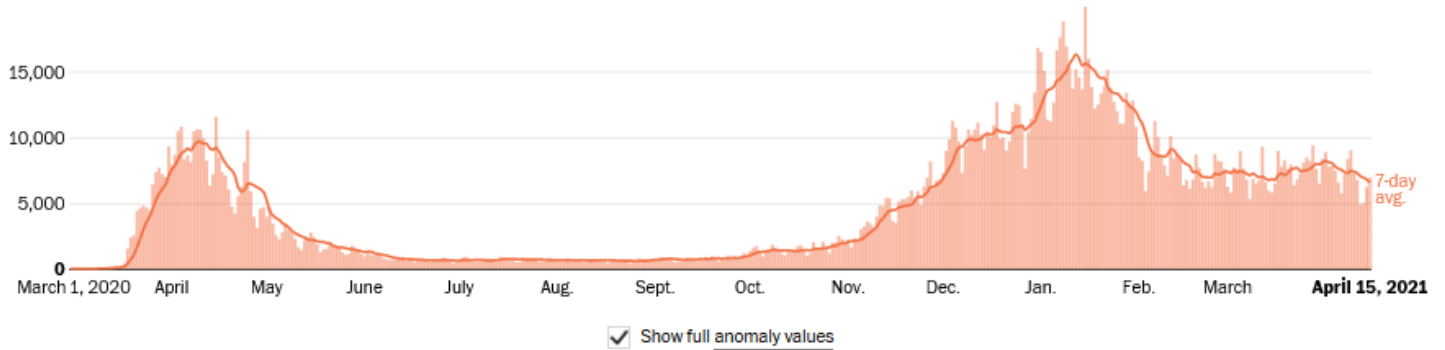

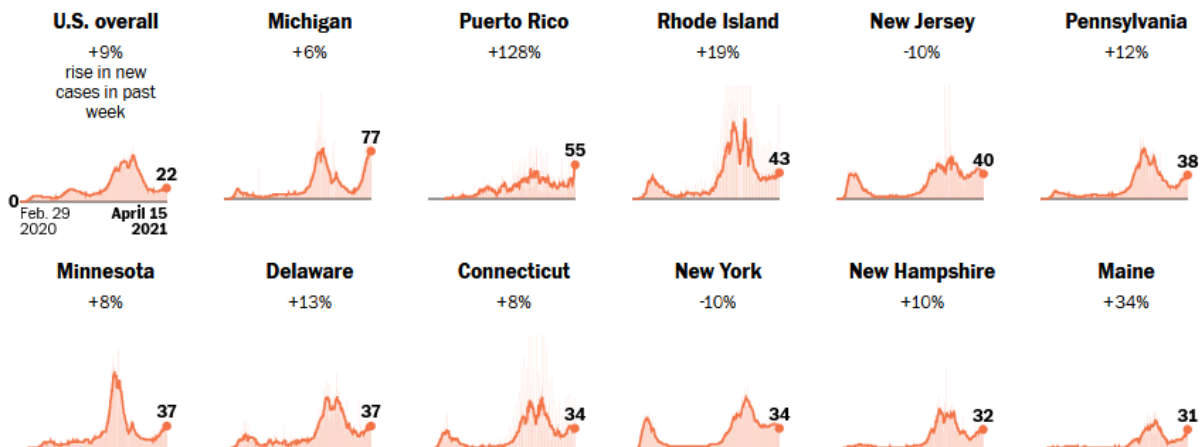

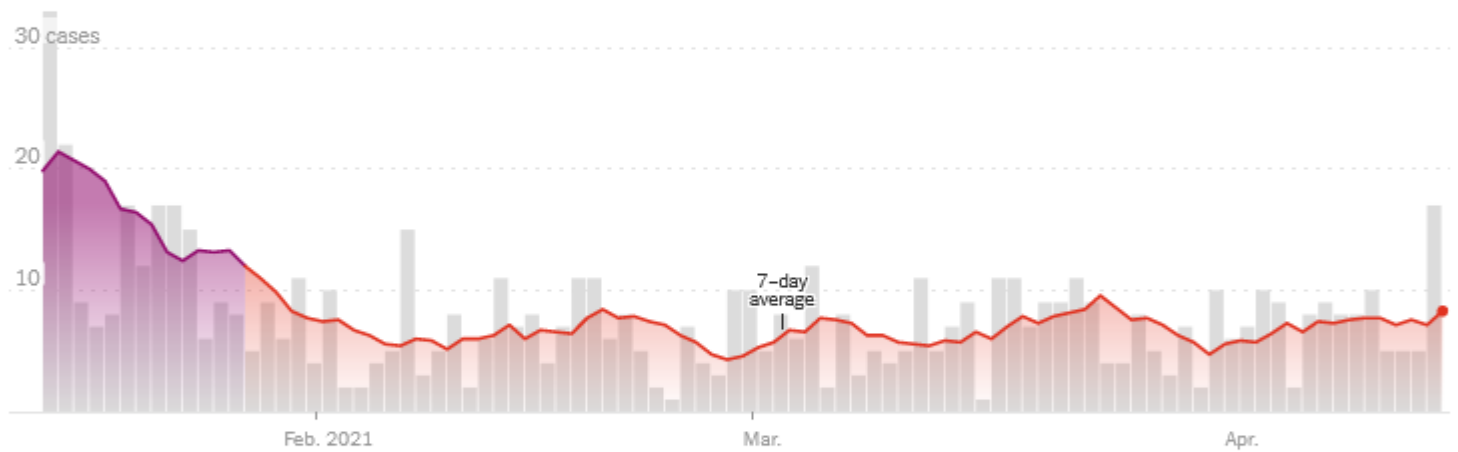

New reported cases by day

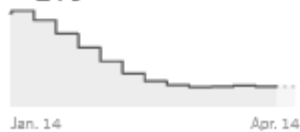

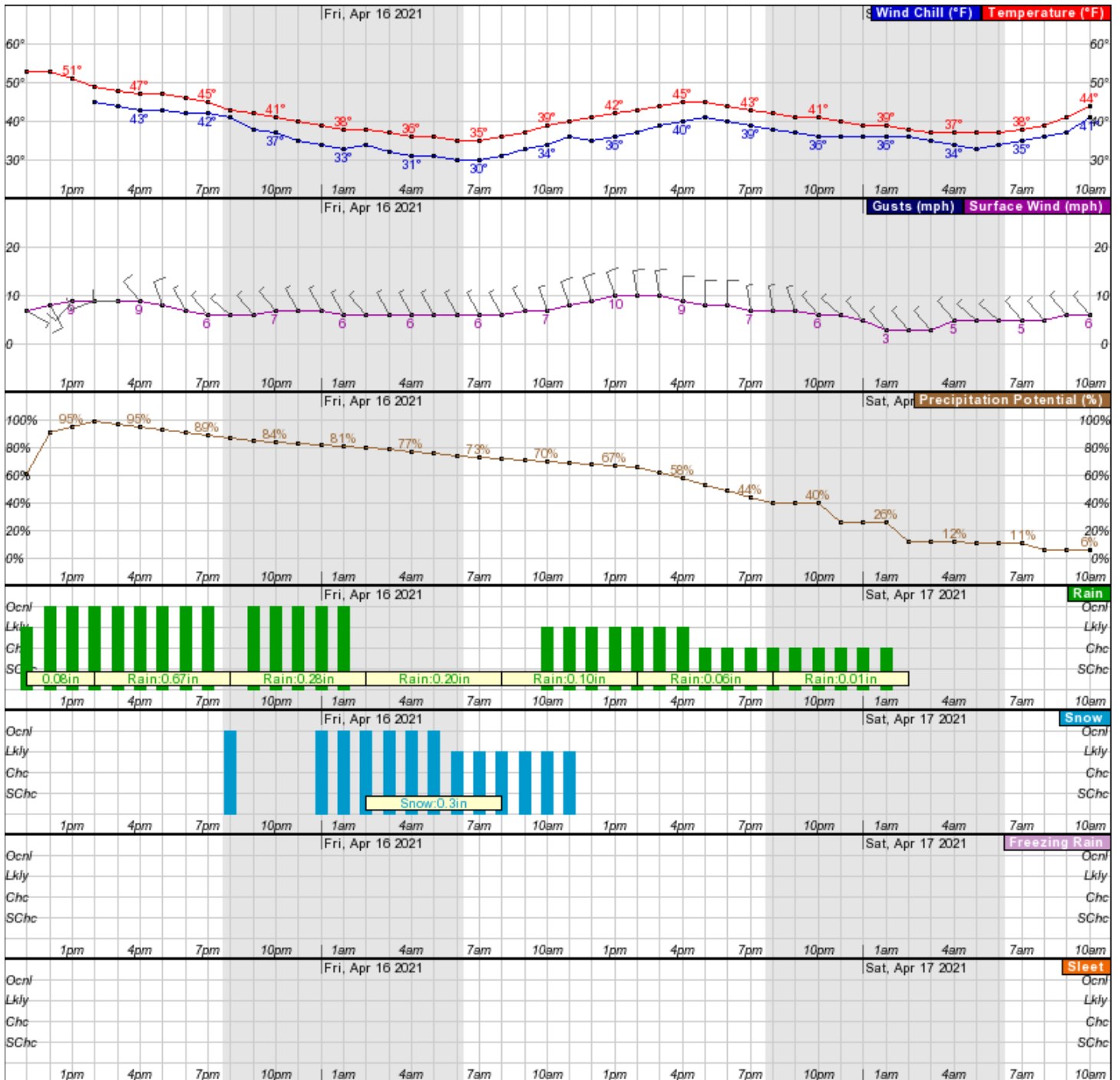
