September 12, 2022 7:00 PM**

**2. Pledge of Allegiance**

- 3. Public Hearing on Local Law 1 of 2022** – Councilman Smith made a motion to open the public hearing. This motion was seconded by Councilman Proudman, motion carried.

Supervisor Federice stated that this law would be an amendment to the already existing law passed in 1984, adjusting the annual income rate for those eligible to receive property tax reductions due to income. Supervisor Federice opened the floor to those present who may have questions regarding the law. No one presented any questions or concerns and Supervisor Federice said that if there were no objections he would like to leave the hearing open until later in the meeting to allow the public and the board to consider the matter further.

- 4. Privilege of the Floor** – Mr. Jack Jessourian requested privilege to talk about the conditions of Briggs Road, on which he resides. He stated that the road has a large number of potholes which he has been filling with pails of gravel and that there is an area he is concerned may wash out at some point if it is not reinforced. He also raised concerns over the road not being graded. He said he doesn't believe it has been graded in the last ten years and that it has not been mowed recently either. He stated that he had approached the highway superintendent about it and felt as though his concerns were brushed off. Supervisor Federice said that Highway Superintendent was not in attendance this evening so he could not speak definitively about the highway department's upcoming schedule, however, they have been incredibly busy all summer replacing culverts and repaving South Mountain Road. He stated that the plan is to begin work on the dirt roads when that project wraps up, but he can not say definitively the order in which

those roads will be addressed as there are several in need of repairs and grading. Mr. Jessourian provided his contact information to the Clerk to pass along to Superintendent Amend.

5. **Minutes:** Review and Approval of Aug 8, 2022 minutes. Councilman Smith made a motion to accept the minutes from the August 8<sup>th</sup> meeting. This was seconded by Councilman Fancher.

#### 6. Assessor's Report

- a. **Marie Stuber** – The assessor has been on vacation but did have a meeting with the Town of Broome assessor, Mark Los, and the County Real Property Tax office to discuss the upcoming revaluation. They will be meeting again on Friday. She is currently attending a data analysis course for assessors to learn to better use the analysis tools available to them. Councilman Proudman made a motion to accept the assessor's report, seconded by Councilman Fancher. Motion carried.

#### 7. Code Enforcement Officer's Report

- a. **Richard Irwin** – The CEO has been keeping very busy with 40 open permits, 13 inspections, and three active enforcements. He has been working on updating all of the SBL folders. At one point during the CEO's report Supervisor Federice had to briefly pause the meeting as two community members had accessed the Supervisor's office and were having a private conversation. The issue was addressed promptly and the meeting resumed within two minutes, with Supervisor Federice apologizing to Mr. Irwin for the interruption. The new fee schedule for building permits is under review and will hopefully be approved in the upcoming weeks. Councilman Smith made a motion to accept the report. This was seconded by Councilman Proudman. Motion carried.

#### 8. Town Clerk's Report

- a. **Carrie Sutton** – There was one dog license renewal for the month and eleven hunting licenses purchased.

#### 9. Town Tax Collector's Report

- a. **Diane Williams** - N/A

## **10. Sewer District Operator's Report**

- a. Travis Castle** – There was an average daily flow rate of 2,572 gallons for August. Items ordered for operations and maintenance have begun to arrive. The 2021 reconciliation has been completed and submitted and scheduling of annual generator maintenance is underway. There was a main pump station alarm on August 29<sup>th</sup>, but there has been no issue since the reset. Currently working on bids from local septic haulers for the upcoming year's budget. Councilman Smith made a motion to accept the sewer district operator's report, seconded by Councilman Proudman. Motion carried.

## **11. Historian's Report**

- a. Kim Young** – Gave a presentation at the August 21<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Mountaintop Seniors group which was well received. Will be attending a historian's conference hosted by the state. Sean Mullen has repaired 13 headstones in the Hubbard Road cemetery and the repairs look wonderful. The historian also presented the board with copies of the Conesville Historical Societies' vision board with regards to the Couchman House repairs and space utilization. Supervisor Federice said that while there will be an update on the house later in the meeting he wanted to make mention of the work Kim did over the weekend tearing out the old carpeting, and how beautiful the floors underneath were. The historical society also received a grant of \$20,000.00 from Nicholas Juried with the directive to use it as startup funds for the historical society and to begin building repairs. Councilman Fancher made a motion to accept the historian's report. Second was given by Councilman Smith. Motion carried.

## **12. Highway Superintendent's Report**

- a. William Amend** – Cold patch paving on South Mountain Rd will be completed by the middle of the month. This job entailed the replacement of 20 culverts and cross-culverts along the road which were damaged to the point they were no longer serviceable. This project would not have been completed so quickly if it was not for the assistance of

Dahlberg Construction, and the highway departments from the towns of Gilboa, Prattsville, Broom, Jefferson, Blenheim, and Windham. The gutter replacement on the garage has been completed. The old flatbed trailer was sent to auction and sold for \$7,800.00 which was good. The plan is to begin work on the unpaved roads in town over the next few weeks. Looking to replace the tractor and mower. Councilman Proudman made a motion to accept the highway superintendent's report. Seconded by Councilman Fancher. Motion carried.

### **13. Supervisors County Report**

- a. **Bill Federice** – Supervisor Federice stated that there was not a great deal to report other than that budget season is in full swing and that if there aren't some feasible solutions soon, some could see their taxes increase by as much as 17%.

### **14. Town Business**

- a. Supervisor's July 2022 Financial report – Councilman Smith made a motion to accept the Supervisor's Financial report. Seconded by Councilman Proudman. Motion carried.
- b. Budget Resolution – Resolution #43 pertaining to the in-house transfer of funds between accounts was presented. A roll call was taken. Supervisor Federice – Aye, Councilman Fancher – Aye, Councilman Proudman – Aye, Councilman Smith – Aye, Councilwoman Mattice – Absent.
- c. Fuel Bids Opening – There were two bids provided for fuel, Main-Care and Sunrise. Sunrise only provided a bid on propane, while Main-Care provided bids on propane, fuel, diesel, and gasoline. Sunrise listed a set price for up to 5,000 gallons of propane, and Main-Care gave price quotes with differential above with a set amount above rack price. Councilman Smith recommended that Sunrise get the bid for the propane if they are willing to increase the number of gallons. The sewer district hasn't been operational for a full year and so the estimates for how much propane is needed may not be accurate. Councilman Fancher pointed out that the school will be moving their buses back to their garage and the Town will

need to heat the old highway garage as well so the pipes don't freeze. Supervisor Federice said he would reach out to the school's financial office to find out how much propane was used at that location last winter and reach out to Sunrise with the request for adjustment. Councilman Fancher made a motion to accept Main-Care's bid for all items, excluding the propane, seconded by Councilman Proudman. Motion carried. Councilman Smith made a motion to award the propane bid to Sunrise, contingent upon the gallon increase. Seconded by Councilman Proudman, the motion carried.

- d. Local Law 1 of 2022 – A motion was made by Councilman Fancher at 8:03 pm to close the public hearing. This was seconded by Councilman Smith. Councilman Smith moved to adopt Local Law 1 of 2022. This was seconded by Councilman Fancher, motion carried.
- e. Couchman House Updates – Supervisor wanted to thank Bill Rouleau for inspecting the house and for creating such an extensive report. Supervisor Federice stated that his major takeaways were that the roof is good, although there are several places where minor repairs are needed, that the chimney will probably have to be removed because it is separating from the building, and that the skylights in the back room leak and should probably also be removed. He believes that the first order of business should be minor roof repairs to prevent any significant damage. There also needs to be an electrical inspection before NYSEG will reconnect the power and the crossbeam supports in the basement need reinforcement. He commended the cleanout efforts of the Historical Society stating that between the two workdays, the bulk of the cleanout has been completed. The next step will be getting estimates on repair costs.
- f. Board Member Input – n/a
- g. Executive Session – At 8:10 pm Councilman Smith made a motion to enter executive session to discuss the union contract exception. This was seconded by Councilman Proudman, motion carried. At 8:40 pm a motion to come out of executive session was made by Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilman Proudman. Motion carried.

- h. Teamsters Contract Alteration – Councilman Proudman made the motion to accept the recommendation from the Teamsters union and Supervisor Federice that the Town co-sign an agreement with the Teamsters permitting on an exception basis the hiring of Gary Case as a full-time Highway Department employee contrary to the Collective Bargaining Agreement requirement that full-time Highway Department employees hold a CDL. Councilman Fancher seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- i. Review Invoices – Councilman Fancher made a motion to review the monthly invoices for approval, Councilman Proudman seconded. Motion carried.

**15. Adjourn**

- a. Councilman Smith made a motion to adjourn the meeting. This was seconded by Councilman Fancher. Motion carried at 9:02 pm.

This is a monthly update for the West Conesville Wastewater Treatment Facility. These are the highlights in your sewer district for the previous month.

- The average daily flow for the month of June was 2,572 gallons a day.
- We have started to receive the items that were ordered for the WWTP.
- We are in the process of scheduling the annual generator service visit with Kinsley Power.
- We have completed and submitted the 2021 reconciliation. All parties have been emailed a copy.
- There was an alarm call at the main pumpstation on August 29<sup>th</sup>. Pump #2 had tripped. We reset the pump and monitored. There has not been any issues with the pump since that night.
- We have reached out to a local septic hauler for a price per gallon of pumped waste for budgeting purposes for next years budget.

## Superintendents Monthly Report, September 2022

The major news is the initial cold patch paving of South Mountain Rd. We will be finishing the road around the middle of this month. Your highway department replaced and/or repaired almost 20 culverts and cross culverts along the road which were bent, rotted and clogged. I would like to recognize the following individuals/towns who were able to help us with this project: Dahlberg Construction; the Towns of Gilboa, Prattsville, Broome, Jefferson, Blenheim and Windham.

The gutters on the town garage have been replaced and the auction for the old trailer went very well, netting a price of \$7800 which is very good. Our only brush mower has suffered a major structural failure and has been put out of service for good. I am in discussions with the town board about replacing the tractor and mower with a John Deere unit and a Diamond mower for next year. At a minimum, there are 6-7 unpaved roads throughout town that need significant upgrades in the very near future, ie: before winter. Moving forward, this will be a great challenge for the highway department and may require some "out of the box" thinking

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption; and

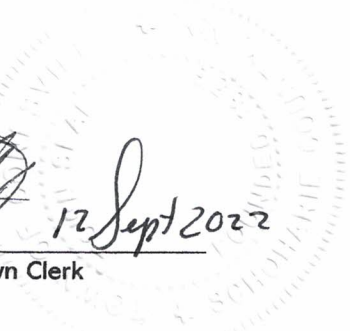
